

THE SPEECH SOUNDS and SYLLABIC RHYTHMS

KEY to markings developed by Kate Reese Hurd

In this key of the markings and fonts used in *The Speech Sound Etudes* manual (2016), the speech sounds in **bold** or followed by ◊ have etudes for them. The markings do not always accord with standard dictionary markings. Instead, they are what I have found to be the most helpful.

With familiarity in practice and rehearsal, they work beautifully!

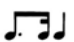
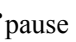
New markings are introduced here for **ǎ**, **āi**, **ōu** and variants of y as a vowel.

Here included are tips for preparing or marking texts for speaking:

- Smaller type or strikethrough can indicate letters that are not or might not be sounded: bomb, gnat, thistles, who, bread, intrigue, eight, knew, wreath, clothes. The same applies to those that are dropped out, elided, as needed in lines of poetry: away, the, between, toward, cannot. These can be replaced by an apostrophe: ‘way, th’, t’ward.
- Write the actual sound above the letter(s).
- Use vertical or *slanted* bars to show the unvoiced vs. *voiced* condition of certain consonants (/s/ = z).

Like Valborg Werbeck-Svårdström in her book, *Uncovering the Voice*, Chapter 6 on the speech sounds, I work with three sets of vowel sounds and have given the sets descriptive names: middle-full – ǎ, ô, o, u, ōu; broad-brighter – ǒ, è/é, ĩ, i (ee), āi, oi; and taller-darker – ŭ/ə, ǒǒ, ũ, ǒ, ü, iu, ui.

NOTE: All markings are *approximations* and reminders. The truth is in hearing and experiencing the nature and nuance of the sound itself (and in eurythmy its gesture). Regional accents will surely differ, too!

- ◊ = bubble over vowels before **R** indicates the **û** sound: spûr, bîrd, vêrve, thÿrse, wôrth
- x = first syllable is heavy: xmeasure
- ˇ = first syllable is light or short: ˇcelestial
- xˇ = move from heavy to light quickly: xˇkitt’ns
- ˇx = move from light to heavy quickly: ˇxbedeck
- = syllable is longer: xˇdazzling xˇminnows
- = dot lengthens a syllable to create a dotted skipping rhythm, as in music: x•stalked ‘n caught =  x•pause ‘n fall = 
- l = articulate between words: cinched^l cellophane
- [a] = intentionally unspoken syllable: [a]‘way

- o = ə/ũ, ton, frǒm dǒve – or use ə to mark (my preference)

- ũ = but, lǒve, flǒod, dǒes, â, thē – or use ə for all (my preference)

- = ĩ, busy

- ui = sweet – an English ũ (German, fŭsse, French, tu)

g = stopped g, sogged, pregnant

g = loosened g shifting toward k, figure, grove

gn = n with silenced g (g given over to n), gnome, gnat, gnarl

GH = f, laugh

gs = gz, begs, be/gs/

gz = zigzags, ba/gs/

h = hen

h = soft kh, human (at front of mouth)

j = jar

j = soft j, zh, *déjà vu* (French, in English: *dézhă vu*), *déjà vu*^{zh}

k = kernal

KH[◊] = human (at front of mouth), humid, Bach^{KH} (at back)

kn = n with silenced k (k given over to n), know, knickers, knead

ks[◊] = flocks

l = low

l = unreleased l, fall, seal, help, wrinkle, whirl

m = moon

m = unreleased m, home, nimble

M = nasal *N*, *chanson* (French, shăNSŏN)

n = nurse

n = unreleased n, swans, shan't

N[◊] = nasal *N* (as in French), uhN-huhN, bouillon

NG[◊] = wing – also **NG**, linger; **NK**, sink; **NQ**, vanquish; **NC**, synchrony

p = pop

p = loosened p shifting toward f, puma, pray

r = round

r = arrested or unreleased r, bear, hark

= zh, casual, Asia^{zh}

sh[◊] = she – also as *sch*; ^{sh}schuss; s, ^{sh}sure, c, ^{sh}ocean; ss, ^{sh}issue; ti, ^{sh}ration

si = zh, soft j, vision (silent i, o sounds as ũ), decision^{zh}

t = toss

t[◊] = chitlins, tout – glottal stop (at back of mouth)

t = loosened t shifting toward ch, truck, eventually

T = stopped t, peat-moss, catnip

= shifted toward d or aspirated with the breath a bit, turtle, star

th[◊] = unvoiced th, thank, ba|th|

th = voiced th, there, then, fea/th/er

ti = sh, veneration (silent i, o sounds as ũ), lotion, na|ti|on^{zh}

ts[◊] = tsar, lots – also as *tes*, routes, kites, Pete's

v = vast

w = wet – also ^wonce

wh[◊] = whirl (note: be sure to sound the h), |wh|irl

wr[◊] = wren

x[◊] = fox – unvoiced x/ks

x = exist – voiced x/gz, Alexandria, eczema, e/x/ist

= z, xylem

y = y as a consonant: yarn – also ^yu, ^yunison, ^yewe

z = zebra

z = ts, Zeppelin

zh = azure, anesthesia^{zh}, treasure^{zh}, mirage^{zh}
